





SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Domin on Lands in Manitoba or the Northest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family. any male over 18 years of age, to the stent of one-quarter section, of 160 cres, more or less. Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the nomesteader desires, he may, on applica-Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make HOMESTEAD DUTIES : A settler who

has been granted an entry for a homestead is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one the following plans: (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is sligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a hometead, the requirements of this Act as to esidence prior to obtaining patent may e satisfied by ich person residing with a father or Lother. (6) If the settler has his permanent

sidence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the APPLICATION FOR PATENT should made at the end of three years, here the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the
