THE VARIOUS DOINGS IN THE RELIGIOUS WORLD.

A Notable Movement—Presbyterians in Korea—The Answer to a Child Gave For a Bible Incident... A Unitarian minister in Massachusetts, the First Unitarian church, Boston, has called to its pastorate Rev. Samuel A. Eliot, son of the president of Harvard college... A notable movement, looking to the evangelization of India by self-supporting Hindu churches, has been launched by the creation of a National Missionary society for all India... Rev. Dr. Woodworth, of the North-West, has secured forty young men in England to carry on the work there... Methodism, he said, was endeavoring to keep pace with the incoming tide of immigration... Rev. Mr. Lamphre, formerly of the Church of St. Mary the Virgin, New York, has been appointed to the rectory of St. Barnabas' church, Ot-

tawa, to succeed Rev. Mr. Bailey. Mr. Lamphre is about 52 years of age... Rev. Dr. Frank Gunsulius, of Chicago, for whom the chair of "the science of the art of preaching" has been created by the Chicago Theological Seminary will exchange pulpits with Rev. R. J. Campbell of City Temple, London, in January... The Bishop of Huron has made the following appointments: Rev. W. H. Hartley, of Sandwich East, to be rector of Blythe; Rev. J. Edmonds, of Blythe, to be rector of Leamington; Rev. Cecil A. Heaven, to be rector of Delhi.

Four missionaries, C. R. Carscallen, B. A. of Dresden, Rev. James Neave and R. D. Ewan, M.D., who go to China, and Rev. R. B. Hennigan, who goes to Japan, gave farewell addresses in Dundas Centre Methodist church, London, recently... Only one day was consumed in the erection of the Armourdale Baptist church, Kansas City, Kansas, last month. The work was done by the volunteer labor of the members, and a prayer meeting was held in the building that night. The church seats two hundred persons... The expenditures of the Methodist missionary society for 1905-6, will include: Home missions, \$15,000; Indians, \$88,000; French, \$8,000; Japan, \$25,000; West China, \$16,000; Chinese in British Columbia, \$3,000; Japanese in British Columbia, \$2,000; salaries at mission stations, \$5,000. Total, \$272,700.

Four Mohammedan converts are being made by Christian missionaries. Two Mohammedans were, however, baptized by missionaries at Delhi, India, this year. They were both led to Christianity by reading books written by the late Rev. Dr. Inad ul Din, of Arrisr, himself a converted Mohammedan... Four denominations of Presbyterian missionaries, have been working in Korea, and they have now united. The similar union movement of Presbyterians in India has been followed by a like organization of the four Congregational bodies. These look toward ultimate consolidation with the Presbyterians... A theatre and a hotel in Sydney, Australia, have been purchased by a Methodist layman and will be remodelled into the Central Methodist mission, at a total cost of a quarter of a million dollars. In addition to halls, one of them seating 3,000 people, the building will contain lodgings and homes for various classes, clubs, gymnasas, etc... (Clergymen sometimes get answers they do not expect from children. One of them was questioning a Sunday school class about the man who fell among thistles on the way from Jerusalem to Jericho. Bringing the story to a point he asked, "Now, why did the priest and Levite pass by on the other side?" TAKES ANOTHER'S NAME

And Filled a Job Dead Man Had Won.

Washington, Oct. 13.—After working two years as a trusted clerk in the bureau of assessments and arrears, Joseph Ford, a murderer and a thief, who has served sentences in prison aggregating more than twenty-three years for manslaughter, assault and larceny, was arrested yesterday afternoon at his office and locked up at police headquarters... He is charged with having impersonated a cousin, Frank A. Sliney, who died a year ago after having successfully passed a civil service examination for a junior clerkship. So thoroughly were officials hoodwinked that on the day when the warrant was obtained for his arrest Ford had his salary raised from \$600 to \$1,200 a year... His arrest came about through an anonymous tip sent to the district attorney a week ago... To Assistant District Attorney Nott Ford confessed that he had impersonated Sliney, and that he had served many years in state's prison. His record shows that he pleaded guilty to grand larceny in 1877, and was sentenced to state's prison for two years and six months.

NATIVES OF NORTH

INTERESTING OBSERVATIONS BY MAJOR MOODIE.

Four Tribes West of Hudson Bay—The Plan the Major Would Adopt to Introduce Civilization Amongst Them... Ottawa Journal... Maj. Moodie, in his report to Comptroller White, says that a ship the size of the Arctic can go right through Chesterfield inlet to Baker Lake, a distance of about four hundred miles to the westward of Hudson Bay. The natives told him so, and it is expected this will be taken advantage of to establish connection with Edmonton by way of Great Slave Lake and the Athabaska River. The natives informed Maj. Moodie that to the west of Baker Lake, fair-sized timber was to be found. They declare it to be growing on the Thelon River and Beverly Lake as far as two feet in diameter, and said they had come from Baker Lake in kayaks and towed the logs back to make kayaks and sleighs... The natives the major says that as far as he has been able to ascertain there are four tribes on the west side of the Hudson Bay, viz: Kenebecatoo, Ivilicks, Netchilicks and Igluliks. Of these the first two are the most civilized, the fields and meadows. The rising generation is not so much imbued with the superstitions of the race and if taken in hand by the government as the Indians have been, I am convinced these superstitions would be eradicated. As a rule they are good workers... "I would take four or five of the head men south in the fall with a good interpreter they know and trust, and show them some of the comforts of civilization. Allow them to spend the winter and part of the summer in the North-West Territories. They could return to the north on the supply vessel I believe that in this way many of them could be induced to go to the Territories as settlers. If located on some large river or lake where they would have boating and fishing, they should make good settlers. If properly handled they could be induced to cultivate the fields and raise stock. By the removal of some in this way game would increase and living would be made easier for those remaining... The major suggests providing hospital facilities for the natives at Fullerton... He makes an interesting suggestion respecting trading with the natives. "In a previous report I suggested that no traders should be allowed in the country but that every police post should be a trading station, where the natives could dispose of their furs; that meat and whaling gear be supplied to the natives to be paid for out of the proceeds of their hunting in instalments. Fair prices should be paid for what they have to sell and no one but the police should be allowed to deal with the natives in any way. All goods purchased should be annually sent south and disposed of. By this method the natives would learn to realize that the police were the power in the land and that only to them could they look for protection or assistance... Major Moodie reports trout plentiful in all the waters on the west of Hudson Bay. In one place natives were taking speckled trout weighing from seven to eight pounds. Game, too, was plentiful... The Arctic got out of Fullerton the first of July after some ice cutting. She started for Churchill but did not have the power to penetrate the ice net and had to abandon the attempt to get in. Going north and to Hudson Strait a good harbor was found forty miles to the west of Cape Wankarem. It was called Prefontaine Harbor in honor of the minister of marine and the promontory which projects it was christened Cape Laurier... The harbor, according to the natives, opens early in the spring, and is packed with ice at any time. A police depot was established there and Prefontaine Harbor will henceforward be the main station for the north-west coast. The harbor is a good one for the coasting trade.
