CASUALTIES OF PEACE.

232 Industrial Accidents in Canada During Month of August.

That peace hath its victories more glorious than war is a truth more freely uttered than appreciated, and while the casualty list in the struggle of the glory of victory, it shows that the risks and the demands on courage increase as the struggle becomes more intense.

In navigation there were eleven fatalities during August. Four men were drowned, four were killed by explosions on steamboats, and two were killed by falling into the hold of the vessels on which they were employed.
