IOMESTEAD REGULATIO

Any even numbered section of Don fon Lands in Manitoba or the Norwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, a eserved, may be homesteaded upon by a person who is the sole head of a familiar any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 16 acres, more or less. acres, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is succeed, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, ditions connected therewith under one
the following plans:

(1) At least six months residence upon
and cultivation of the land in each year
during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the
father is deceased) of any person who is
eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides
upon a farm in the vicinity of the land
entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to
residence prior to obtaining patent may
be satisfied by ach person residing with
he father or nother.

(8) If the settler has his permanent
residence upon farming land owned by
him in the vicinity of his homestead, the
requirements of this Act as to residence
may be satisfied by residence upon the
