



HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family. or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 300 acres, more or less. Entry may be made personally at lice local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is smeated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make HOMESTEAD DUTIES : A settler who, as been granted an entry for a home-

stead is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one the following plane : (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.
