SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN, NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Deminton Leads in Manitoba or the North-west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigra-tion, Winnipeg, or the local agent for tae district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make
