Value Of Buttermilk Buttermilk is not generally consideration ered of much importance as a feed for nogs, but from careful investigations t has been demonstrated that but-

termilic is fully as fattening as separator milk, provided it has not too much water put into it. Better results will be obtained by its use if taken right from the churn and allowed to stand for several days. The Danish experiment station regards six pounds of separator milk as the equivalent of one pound of grain. If buttermilk is equal in fattening powers to skim milk, then taking corn as basis a barrel of buttermilk would be equal in value to one bushel of corn. Buttermilk will have a great deal more value than if it is fed in limited nantities. It is thrown away as waste in many sections of the country, the creameries not having any
