Phraseology At The Elections.

Who got the zephyr vote, in the New York election yesterday? "What is it?" asked Mr. Devery in an interview just before the polling. "A zephyr vote is a feller that comes to you, gives you the glad hand, and tells you he is going to vote for you. Then he blows away into thin air on election day." So many men in Kingston, candidates of one sort and another, have had an experience with this vanishing element. They have canvassed the wards, for the representation of them in the council, have counted up the promised votes until it seemed as if it was a mere formality to register the will of the people in their favour, and they have discovered later on how immaterial or chimerical was the support of their alleged friends. Some others have had higher ambitions with disappointing results. It takes a man of Devery's stamp to delineate the episodes of political life in powerful and unique prose. The zephyr vote describes the shifty and unstable character of many of the electors, and "the third rail," the outer one on the elevated railway system—represents the candidate and his emotions. "It's always a hot iron until the power is on, but it's cold enough when the power is turned off."

Feeling Of The People.

It is remarkable that the salary grab and the pension scheme, which passed parliament so quietly, because a subject that was discussed more in private than in public, is the great issue in the by-elections. All other subjects are regarded as of secondary importance. At least it is the question of which the candidates make special mention, and this is taken as an indication that it holds first place in the mind of the elector. Nor is the denunciation of grab and scheme confined to any man or party. It has been contended that the indemnity paid to some men does not compensate them for the time and money they lose by devotion to the public service. Yet also candidates in the by-elections are pretty unanimous in their disapproval of the larger indemnity. The liberal candidate in Lambton leads in the demand for reformatory legislation. The liberal candidate in North York, Hon. Mr. Aylesworth, announces that if elected he will deem it incumbent upon him to give consideration to the question, and especially to the task of changing the pension system. All this demonstrates that the people are not disposed to be forgetful of an experience in parliament that is the more obnoxious because it affects both parties, in the same way to the same extent.

Boss Rule Is Checked.

The result of the election in New York city, on Tuesday, was according to expectations. It was a very close contest for the mayoralty, and as hot as those who participated in it desired. Tammany Hall was again, not upon its merits—for it has nothing to offer for public administration—but because McEllan, represented in his person the best that can be expressed by a demagogue with some degree of self-assurance.

The mayor-elect is an able man, but of course he is under the thumb of Mr. Murphy, Tammany's chief, and is not free to do as he likes. He will give the city as good government as one man can give to it—under the restriction of a very venal institution.

Mr. McEllan was not elected with a sweeping vote. He had not much of a sweep of Hearst, and he would not have been re-elected had not the republicans rallied to his side and given him some help. They had to save the combine from complete annihilation. Murphy and Odell, have, however, received a warning which they will not forget.

The triumph of the hour is in the election of William Travers Jerome, the district attorney, whose name stands for all that is courageous and progressive and independent in public life. He defied the bosses and he has beaten them badly, despite all their unholy deeds and alliances. A less brave man would have hesitated in accepting his task. But he had behind him the best men in the community, of all parties, and it has been advertised to the world that where a public prosecutor, "and the terror of evil doers," as Mr. Choate called him, does his duty, wholly and fearlessly, he can command the confidence and support of the people.

The machine, as it is represented in New York politics, may still be visible but it must be badly damaged as a result of the election, and some parts of it may never be used again.
