THE O.H.A. MEETING

D.L. DARROCH SECURED THE PRESIDENCY.

Dr. Clarke Defeated by 11 Votes—Association Made Slight Changes in Rules for the Betterment of the Game.

Toronto, Nov. 13.—Ontario Hockey Association in concluding its sixteenth annual meeting on Saturday, passed a unanimous resolution recording its highest appreciation of the retiring president, Ross Robertson, after six years of service and it was decided to further honor Mr. Robertson by making him the recipient of a fitting testimonial. Mr. Robertson is not retiring from the O.H.A., as he has been elected to the executive for this year.

D. L. Darroch of Collingwood was elected to succeed Mr. Robertson by a majority of eleven votes over Dr. C. K. Clarke.

The association voted an honorarium of \$400 to Secretary Hewitt and one of \$50 to the treasurer, A. W. Macpherson of Peterboro. A vote of thanks to the retiring executive was passed.

The election of officers resulted as follows: President, D. L. Darroch, Collingwood; first vice-president, J. C. Makins, Stratford; (acclamation); secretary, W. A. Hewitt, Toronto; (acclamation); treasurer, A. W. Macpherson, Peterboro; (acclamation); executive, L. B. Duff, Welland; H. D. Jamieson, Barrie; D. Turner, Midland; R. J. Burns, Toronto.

The report of the treasurer showed a cash balance from last year of \$1,205.92, and both it and the report of the secretary were adopted.

The association enacted as follows: No. 1. Officiaries are to be declared on the defending side taking the puck from the goalkeeper, within a space of three feet from the goal—Secretary W. A. Hewitt.

Referees shall be required to measure the goals before each game.—Secretary W. A. Hewitt.

Stick are to be composed entirely of wood.—J. Ross Robertson.

Annual club fee is raised from \$5 to \$6, in order to provide each club with ten copies of the constitution and rules.—Secretary W. A. Hewitt.

Date of annual meeting is changed from the second to the third Saturday in November.—Secretary W. A. Hewitt.

Mileage is raised from five cents to ten cents for eight men to guard against loss of time.—Secretary W. A. Hewitt.

Playing certificates are to be issued to all players, senior, junior and intermediate, a junior certificate to entitle a player to play in any series above, but not vice-versa.—Secretary W. A. Hewitt.

Enforcement of personal service on any of the recognized officers of a club or service by registered post on either the president or secretary of a club is to be a sufficient service in the matter of protests and evidence in them.—W. B. Collinson.

A proposal of Vice-President Chown to change the date of qualification of players was lost on a second vote, after Mr. Wilson of Port Colborne had protested against it.

R. J. Burns moved to allow the senior O. H. A. champions to play for the Stanley Cup. His amendment was opposed by D. L. Darroch, Francis Nelson and Dr. Clarke. The present rule covered the time of the year and would leave the gate wide open. There would be no safeguard, as the new rule would allow the O. H. A. members to play the holders of the cup, no matter what the composition of that team. The vote stood 23 to 16 in favor of the motion, but not being a two-thirds vote, was lost.

Ross Robertson, introduced an amendment to do away with goals scored on hits, for the purpose of discussion. It got not a vote.

The plan of A. W. Macpherson to give the executive the power to transfer a team from one series to the one below after it has played one game, and lost, it was said that the transfer of a team would disarrange the whole series below.

Mr. Travis of Galt moved to raise the fee of all clubs from \$5 to \$10. The plan was to cut the O. H. A. out of a share in the final game and to make up the difference by taxing clubs \$5 each. His motion was lost.

Gananogue won. The junior O. R. F. U. match, Saturday, between Limestone II. and Gananogue, in the manufacturing town, required 8 to 2 against the Kingston team. This past local aggregation out of business for the championship; had they won it would have been a tie all around. The game was fairly clean, but the field was heavy with mud. At half time the score was 2 to 2, each team having made two safety touches. Gananogue had the wind in the second half, and the Limestones did no scoring; Gananogue made two rousages and two touches-in-goal. The teams were:
