HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Domin-lon Laads in Manitoba or the North-west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 screen, more or less. Entry may be made personally at the ocal land office for the district in which local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the himister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make

entry for him.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for a humestead is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one he following plans :

(1) At least six months residence upon and caltivation of the land in each year during the term of taree years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the tather is deceased of any person who is eligible to make a nomestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides spon a farm in the vicinity of the land satered for by such person as a home-gread, the requirements of this Act as to dence prior to obtaining patent may satisfied by ach person residing with (8) If the settler has his permanent

residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, be-lore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the estead laspector.

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual or company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents ton of 2,000 pounds shall be collecte

tranted upon payment in advance of \$7.50 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital.

A free miner, having discovered mineral is place, may locate a claim 1,500x 1,500 feet.

The see for recording a claim is \$5.

At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining recorder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may.

Spon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 2½ per cent on the sales.

PLACER mining claims generally are 100 feet square; entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

A free miner may obtain two leases to dredge for gold of five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior. The lease shall have a dredge in operation within one season from the date of the lease for each five miles. Rental, \$10 per annum for each mile of river leased. toyalty at the rate of 2½ per cent collected on the output after it exceeds \$10,000.
