PLUMBERS CONSPIRACY CASE Some Pretty Details Have Come

Joseph Harrison, a former member of the Master Plumbers' Association, gave some interesting evidence, as to the amount of the rake off distributed among the tenderers on particular jobs recently. For instance on the Guelph sanitarium, \$500 was divided up among four others. The Warwick Bros' and Rutter building 8600, had been divided among twelve plumbing tenderers, exclusive of the steam fitting. On the Toronto isolation hospital, 8250 was divided up. Witness said that his business had dropped \$121,000 in 1903 to less than 882,000 in 1905, because the association had refused to allow him to take contracts, from outside towns, on which he had tendered.
