COMPLAINTS OF DUMPING.

American Hat Frame Company Troubled.

Toronto, Nov. 18.—Before the tariff commission, this morning, J. J. Parkman, of the American Hat Frame company, complained of severe competition and dumping by one United States firm.

Messrs. Joseph Cannon, of Granite Co., and P. Thompson, of the Thompson Monument Co., asked for an increase in the duty on finished granite from thirty-five per cent. to fifty per cent.

Principal Audin, of Upper Canada College, and Prof. MacCallum, of the University of Toronto, asked for the amendment to the clause respecting the admission of apparatus, maps, etchings, photographs, paints, charts, etc., for educational, philosophical, religious or scientific institutions.

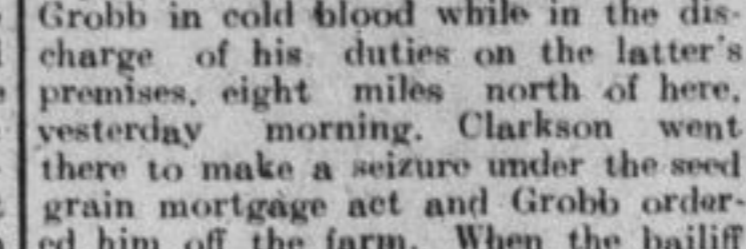
