

The shortage is most in evidence in the big surplus states, New York, parts of New England, Michigan, and a number of sections in the south-west. The crop of 1905 is estimated at 23,500,000 barrels, compared again passing with 45,360,000 barrels one year ago, and compared with the small yield of 1901, approximating 27,000,000 barrels, and the largest crop on record, in 1896, when it approaches 70,000,-000 barrels. In the great producing sections of the middle and central states, including New York and Michigan, the crop is placed by this authority somewhat less than 9,000,000 barrels, against 20,000,000 barrels one year ago, and figures approaching the last named for two or three years. 
