HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any evan numbered section of Domin-fon Lands in Manitoba or the North-west Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family. or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 Entry may be made personally at the the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior. Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to mak HOMESTEAD DUTIES : A settler who has been granted an entry for a home stead is required to perform the con-

the following plans : (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.
(2) If the father (or mother- if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by ich person residing with he father or Lother.

he father or Liother.

(8) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, be-fore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.

Before making application for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention WEST MINING REGULATIONS. Coal.—Coal lands may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for

Quartz.-A free miner's certificate is stranted upon payment in advance of \$7.50 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a com-

pany according to capital.

A free miner, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500 feet. The see for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the

claim each year or paid to the mining re-corder in lieu thereof. When \$500 has been expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, pur-chase the land at \$1 an acre. The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 24 per cent on the sales.







Feed clover, alfalfa or other leguminous hay so that the will become accustomed to feeding or roughage before cold winter months. Sheaf oats make a good roughage feed. When winter comes provide the calves with the cleanest quarters possible, affording plenty of bedding and a chance to take exercise.
