

Board of Health Orders Steriligation of All That Barbers Use

A special' despatch from Boston, May 5th, 1900, to the New York Sun, gives new regulations of the Boston Board of Health as to barber shops : "Mugs, shaving brushes and razors shall be sterilized after each separate use thereof. A separate, clean towel shall be used for each person. Material to stop the flow of blood shall be lus d only in powdered form, and appl'ed on a towel. Powder puffs are prohibited."
