THE SPORT REVIEW ATTEMPT TO PROFESSIONALIZE BY TORONTO.

Accusation by Montreal Star—Cornell Oarsmen Are Practising on the Water at This Late Winter Date.

The Canadian Rugby Football Union meets in Ottawa, Saturday, January 13th. Eminent turf authorities in England are seriously advocating an embargo upon two-year-old racing until June of each year.

National League Baseball Clubs have been asked to waive claim to the service of "Jim" Delehanty by the Boston club.

The first junior game of group No. 2, O.H.A., between Cobourg and Belleville, resulted in a victory for Cobourg by 8 to 3.

The team of the 40th Separate Company, New York National Guard, defeated McGill College, of Montreal, at basketball at Odgenburg, 36 to 11.

W. K. Vanderbilt's stable of race horses, which will be raced this year in France, comprises forty-six race horses, of which fourteen are three-year-olds and twenty-nine are two-year-olds.

HARRY C. PULLIAM, Baseball League made such an excellent record during his administration, that he was re-elected for the position with scarcely any opposition.

The Eastern Canada Amateur Hockey Association has received the idea of forming an association, embracing all the senior, intermediate, and junior clubs of Eastern Ontario and Quebec, and if possible those of the maritime provinces.

The new arena rink in Fort William has been opened. It is said to be one of the best in the west. The dimensions are 120 by 220 feet, with an ice surface of 85 by 150 feet. There is seating accommodation for 2,500 and standing room for 1,000 more.

In the opening game of the New Brunswick Hockey League, Fredericton won a rough game from Miramichi by the score of 180 to 10. One thousand people witnessed the contest. Rowan scored the only goal. "Tony" Warwick, of Corwall, Ont., played point for Miramichi.

For the first time in the history of the N.E. aquatics, the Cornell oarsmen are enjoying practice on the water in January. Friday, with a temperature of forty-seven and a warm south wind, Coach Courtney took advantage of the springlike weather and had the candidates for the crews rowing nearly two hours on Cayuga Inlet. This practice will be continued as long as the weather permits.

Morris Wood, of Verona Lake, N.J., amateur champion skater of America, has accepted the challenge issue by Fred Robson, of Toronto, who holds the Canadian record, for 200 yards. The challenge left the choice of place to Wood, among New York, Montreal and Toronto, and the New Yorker chose Toronto. The races will be 220 yards, half a mile and mile, and will take place there towards the end of the month, with a suitable trophy as the prize.

An attempt is being made by the way of Toronto to entirely professionalize all lacrosse, declares the Montreal Star, which says that the Montreal Island privileges, who would like to have teams from Montreal, Shamrock and Ottawa Capitals to come to Toronto and increase the gate receipts. They have enlisted certain Toronto papers in their project, as they will be seen from a submitted Toronto dispatch, which they have sent emissaries to Ottawa and Montreal at different times. The last time was New Year's eve, when a representative of the Toronto press was invited to try his best to get Montreal lacrosse magnates to agree to the professional scheme proposed by his principals. He claimed to have met with great success in Ottawa, where, as seems Mr. Moran was quite prepared to go into the scheme, but in Montreal, he said to the credit of those to whom are entrusted the interests of Canada's national summer game, he struck a snag.

International Kite-Flying. The British Meteorological committee has assigned a portion of its parliamentary grant for the investigation of the upper air by kite and other means, in order to determine the weather and the temperature of the earth.

An experimental station will be established in England and instruments provided for kite ascents, and other methods of investigations, and funds will be provided for the publication of the observations and the deductions from them.

Certain "international days" will be chosen, when kites will be sent up simultaneously in England, France, Germany and Russia.

BETTER GROUPING A REARRANGEMENT WOULD SERVE PUBLIC INTERESTS.

The Marine Portfolio—A Minister of Mines Would Find Plenty to Do—Inland Revenue Department Amalgamated With Customs Service.

Ottawa, Jan. 4.—At this time, when rumors of cabinet changes and of rearrangement of departmental work are in the air, the following suggestions may be in the public interest. It is taken for granted that Hon. L. P. Brodeur will be translated to the department of marine and fisheries. The portfolio is one which ought to go to an eastern man, seeing that it is intimately identified with the St. Lawrence navigation and the important fisheries of the Atlantic as well as those of the Pacific, to say nothing of the great inland lakes.

The transfer of Mr. Brodeur to marine and fisheries will leave the inland revenue department without a head. It is necessary, however, to continue this branch of the public service as a separate department. Your correspondent does not think so. Customs and excise are to some extent related to each other and the two might well be consolidated under Mr. Patterson. This could be done without any great difficulty.

From British Columbia comes the demand for a representative in the cabinet to share in the administrative work of the government. Hon. William Tompkinson is already minister of the interior. It is proposed to add to customs how is to be given a department? By the creation of a new department. The minister of the interior is unduly burdened with work and ought to be relieved of the pressure upon him. It is proposed to add to the department of the interior is the mines branch. This might be elevated into a department with Mr. Tompkinson at its head. Seeing that British Columbia is essentially a mining province, the appointment of this step could not be gainsaid. The geological survey might also go into the department of mines, and no doubt Mr. Oliver would welcome the transfer.

A department of mines could render the country invaluable service. Already as a minor branch it has undertaken work of the highest importance in connection with the application of electricity to the smelting of iron ores and the manufacture of steel and the development of the immense zinc deposits of mica and asbestos which abound in Quebec have been mapped out and their location, extent and development reported upon in a thoroughly practical way. Such cases of valuable character of the mineral resources of Canada so as to induce the investment of capital and the establishment of new industries is a subject well worthy of greater consideration from the government.

Turning to the duties devolving upon some of the departments, it should be pointed out that at least three are doing work of a somewhat similar character. Public works, is, of course, the great construction branch of the public service but there are also works of construction carried out by the marine department and the canal branch of the railway department.

Here, surely, is a chance for amalgamation, not of departments, but of branches, which are doing similar classes of work.

Some of the suggestions here outlined should commend themselves to the government and be carried into effect. The matter of cabinet appointments will not be taken up until the end of the present month. The filling of the present vacancy will then be dealt with, and Sir Wilfrid, if he is so disposed, can carry out a reconstruction which without disturbing would greatly improve the existing order of things.
