THEY SHOULD KNOW

THERE IS SOME PROTECTION FROM USURY. If Misrepresentation or Concealment can be Proven Only Legal Rate of Interest is Chargeable—Penalties for Violation of Act.

Toronto, Jan. 8.—Dr. P. Howard Hunter, inspector of insurance companies and registrar of loan corporations, speaking in regard to the methods of usurers, as revealed in some recent instances expressed the opinion that magistrates should have authority to hear charges arising from such cases in camera.

Attention was drawn by Dr. Hunter to a clause of the act of 1903, one of several acts framed with the sole purpose of protecting people who borrow small amounts of money from outrageous interest charges.

then the loan may be liquidated by the amount actually borrowed, together with the legal rate of interest—five per cent. This clause can be enforced before any magistrate or justice of the peace.

It is also provided in the same act that "the cost of the loan," a phrase which has often been used in the courts, means the financial detriment of the borrower, means the whole cost, but does not include actual disbursements for legal charges, such as those for local master of deeds, clerk of the county court, the sheriff or the treasurer of a municipality where it is necessary to file papers, make searches, or otherwise transact business with the officials mentioned, for which he is allowed a fee.

In some cases, in addition to the legal charges, varying amounts are charged borrowers as the "cost of the loan," occasionally as high as \$200.

The penalties mentioned in the clause quoted are: A fine of \$200 for a first conviction, and for subsequent convictions, imprisonment not exceeding a term of twelve months.

Strong Year of Railway Building and Progress. New York, Jan. 8.—Henry Clews, the reliable banker reports: The year opens under most favorable auspices. General business conditions are satisfactory and ought to continue so, until next harvest, so far as the market is concerned there are but two dangers, and these are serious: An over-extension of credit and the fostering of undue speculation.

Outside of speculation the market is likely to have the support of strong banking interests for some time. There will be important new issues of securities, particularly railroad stocks, and bankers who usually finance such deals do not wish the market spoiled by excessive speculation.

The railroad mileage increased only 18 per cent., less than the increase in population, while the tonnage of the roads increased over 100 per cent. Between the Mississippi and the Pacific there is strong need of additional mileage, and we will see one or two years of active road construction.
