BOARD OF EDUCATION

WILLIAM KELLY ELECTED CHAIRMAN.

The Standing Committee Appointed—Discussion on Mr. Nickle's Resignation—Collegiate Teacher Appointed.

The inaugural meeting of the Board of Education for 1906 took place last evening. In attendance were Trustees Kelly, Elliott, Lambert, Marshall, Bennett, Godwin, Meek, Wormwith, Martin, Lyons, Haffer, McLean, Renton, Henderson, Laturney, Macgillivray and Thompson.

The newly elected trustees, Messrs. Godwin, McLean, Thompson, Laturney, Bennett, and Henderson, were sworn in by Mayor Mowat, Capt. Denally was absent.

Mayor Mowat addressed a few words to the board. It gave him great pleasure, he said, to perform his first official act in connection with the Board of Education.

The board then took a ballot for the election of a chairman, and the result was: Kelly, 11; Wormwith, 3; Laturney, 1; Henderson, 1; Godwin, 1; Meek, 1. Mr. Kelly was accordingly declared elected.

Chairman Kelly in thanking the board for the honor conferred upon him, stated that to be placed in the line of succession in Kingston's educational matters with the brilliant men who had preceded him was no mean or ordinary compliment.
