COMMERCIAL MATTERS.

That Is Going On In the Business World—The Markets.

A company has been formed in Greece for buying up unused currants and converting them into alcohol. Norway exported about 68,000,000 pounds of fish cod and more than half that amount of salt cod last year. With \$200,000 capital a steamship company has been organized at Athens, Greece, to carry emigrants to the United States. The United States Smelting Refining and Mining company has been organized under the laws of the state of Maine, with authorized capital of \$20,000,000. An Ohio court has held that if the holder of a life policy has good grounds for a case against the company, it is his duty to sue, not himself, who have a right to sue. The American Car & Foundry Co. reports a surplus of \$192,739 after the payment of \$525,000 of dividends for the quarter ending October 31st. The surplus is \$12,000,448 for 1903, or an increase of 50 per cent. The Canadian Pacific Railway company has made a general increase in the selling price of its land ranging from 2 to 5 acres upwards. It is estimated that the value of the company's land holdings in the west have increased in value from \$15,000,000 to \$30,000,000 during the past year. Much of the land that was selling at \$5 an acre a few years ago is now worth about double that sum and is constantly increasing in value.
