

WOOING ELECTORS

HOW SOME MEMBERS WIN THEIR SEATS.

The Wives of Candidates Are a Great Help in Many Instances—Some Exciting and Amusing Episodes in Getting Voters to the Poll.

London, Feb. 10.—Success in wooing the electors often depends upon small considerations. The nimble tongue of a candidate may win him voters in quarters where his political programme makes no appeal. At one election meeting the proceedings were getting uproarious. "Shut up," cried a voice, interrupting the candidate's statement of his principles. "You haven't a leg to stand on." "All the more reason why I should have the seat," was the candidate's quick and happy reply. Its immediate effect was to put the audience in good humor, and no doubt it convinced many of the electors that the candidate was the best man to represent them in parliament.

TRAPPER'S AWFUL DEATH.

Perished in a Fire Which Destroyed His Home.

Smith's Falls, Ont., Jan. 15.—Augustus Sabraw, a fisherman and trapper, met an awful death in a fire which destroyed his home Saturday night. He lived alone in a small shanty on the river bank three miles from town. About 8:30 some neighbors noticed the blaze of a fire in the direction of Sabraw's hut, and started at once for the place. When they got there they found it enveloped in flames, and lying on the floor inside they could see Sabraw himself. He was being burned to death, but they could do nothing to save him. The house was completely burned up, and not a stick or board of it remained. Dr. McCallum, the coroner, was called, but an inquest was not deemed necessary. Both legs and both arms were burned away from the body, and the face and head were gone. The unfortunate man was addicted to liquor and his death is to be regretted without doubt, but the fact is, he was in town on Friday, selling fish, and he had evidently taken a supply of liquor home with him. Besides his charred remains there lay a large whiskey bottle, empty.

TWO GIRL VICTIMS.

Burned to Death in British Columbia.

Vancouver, B.C., Jan. 17.—Two girls, one red, the other white, have been burned to death in this province in the last few days. The Indian girl, who was three years old, fell into a camp fire during the progress of a potlach at Nannaimo. She lingered for three days, suffering much agony, and then succumbed.

Canadian Minister of Finance Offers Advice.
