

Honey that has been adulterated after being extracted from the combs, will not granulate. It is impossible to keep honey from granulating after it has been extracted from the combs, unless it is kept in a room where the thermometer will register ninety grees. Just as soon as the weather begins to get cool, in the fall of the year, honey begins to get thick, and before winter sets in it will be granu-
