upon a wintry sea, swept by a keen and biting wind. Within twenty-four hours, you are at the edge of the gulf stream, and from there onward, the temperature becomes milder, until on the third day you sight Wathings Island, better known as San Salvador, the first landing place of Columbus. On the fourth day the steamer passes Cape Maise, after running within plain sight of Castle and Fortune Islands, while passing through the Crooked Island Passage. A few hours of further sailing brings the Island of Jamaica into view.
