SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS Any even numbered section of Dominaton Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not eserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family of any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres, more or less. Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which sland to be taken is studated, or if the comesteader desires, he may, on applica-tion to the Minister of the Interior, tion, Winnipeg. or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make HOMESTEAD DUTIES : A settler who tes been granted an entry for a home-stead is required to perform the con-ditions connected therewith under one following plans; (1) At least six months residence upon d cultivation of the land in each year aring the term of three years.
(2) If the father (or mother- if the

tather is deceased of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry unter the provisions of this Act, resides appear a farm in the vicinity of the land satered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtain sesidence prior to obtaining patent may be father or tother.

(8) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT should ore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent he settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Do-minion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention


