First Duty of the City Council is to Appoint a Permanent General Manager-Claims That at You Will Present There Are Two Executive Heads.

Ald. Polson, who has been stirring up things in the civic light, heat and power committee meetings, was asked if he was in favor of extending the works at once, as suggested by Mr. Campbell. In reply he said:

"The first duty of the city council is appoint a manager capable of handling both the electric and gas departments, and making him absolute ly responsible for the commercial success of the plant. Under existing conditions, Mr. Campbell is simply dis charging the duties of an expert, the committee performing the legislative function, and instead of perfect co-operation, two executive heads of the department act separately. No city can afford to have \$300,000 invested, as Kingston shortly will have if th plant is to be effective, unless one man is responsible to council for it. successful conduct.

"In regard to extensions, I shall not give my consent to further expenditure till the management is made more effective than at present.
