NEWS OF THE WORLD

Matters That Interest Everybody—Notes From All Over—Little of Everything Easily Read and Remembered.

The provincial government is considering a new scheme regarding civil servants' salaries. Ten thousand coal and iron miners in the region of Pennsylvania, Pa., have gone on strike.

The Michigan hockey team played rings around the Canadian Sox last night, defeating them by a score of 15 to 4. The Canadians were outplayed at every turn.

Mr. Humphrey, forty-seven miles west of Saskatoon, started home with a load of wood when his sleigh upset and he was pinned between a load of wood and a tree. He was found the same night frozen stiff.

At least twenty-eight men are supposed to have met death in a terrible mine explosion in the Parallel mine, of the Stewart Collieries company, near Oakhill, W. Va. Thirty-nine men were employed in the mine and only eleven have escaped alive.

John Lee, a Swede, was instantly killed on Thursday morning, at Osterlund, on C.P.R., by the premature explosion of dynamite while charging a rail, being thrown down an embankment, a distance of thirty-five feet.

An American syndicate has secured from Russia a thirty-six years' concession for railway in Central Asia, on the condition of furnishing a guarantee of \$40,000,000 that the government will be allowed to redeem the roads on the expiration of twenty-four years.

The prospects for the coming season of the Kitchener & Ontario Navigation company are regarded as exceptional. It is bright and, according to Mr. Henry, the summer of 1906 will be a record one.

PREJUDICED JURIES. Wallace Nesbitt, K.C., Makes a Strong Statement.

Toronto, Feb. 9.—A peculiar statement was made in the court of appeals, today, by Wallace Nesbitt, K.C., addressing the court in the action of Mulvaney against the Toronto Railway company. The plaintiff is suing for damages for the death of his daughter Lillian, and Mr. Nesbitt was representing the company.

FURNACES FED BY BALLOTS. Merchants Premium Company Will Reorganize. Toronto, Feb. 9.—The Merchants Premium company, which carried on a furniture business in Toronto and Hamilton, and which was in liquidation, will be reorganized. The liabilities are \$8,000, and the assets \$3,000, and the court gave the company sixty days to re-organize.

WANTS CONCESSIONS. From Turkey for Gold Mines—England Protests. Constantinople, Feb. 9.—Germany is seeking from Turkey a concession for the exploitation of the gold mines on the island of Thasos, which is now used for an naval station. England has protested against the granting of such permission to Germany.

Hunter Meets His Death. Vancouver, B.C., Feb. 9.—While hunting on Broughton Island, off the northern coast, Frederick Bibeau, a hunter and trapper, accidentally shot himself, on Sunday last. He was carried by his partner, Roy Simpson, two miles to their boat, and then started for Emmerston's camp.

Ottawa's Ice Race. Ottawa, Feb. 8.—Headlight, the Gananoque horse, owned by W. R. Aulton, took the first heat of the 2.28 race which will be finished tomorrow. Two stake events were furnished the card at Central Canada ice races today.

King Edward Refused. London, Feb. 9.—John Burns, M.P., the newly appointed chairman of the board of works, according to Ontario, in Lake Simcoe district, for militia purposes, in place of the present camp site, at Niagara, as the owners asked too much for the land.

Supposed He Was Drowned. Ottawa, Ont., Feb. 9.—Michael Pasko, a laborer, employed at Booth's, paid mail, on the dune, is supposed to have been drowned, yesterday, about noon. He has not been seen since that time. He leaves a wife and one child, and had only been married fourteen months. He came to Ottawa from Renfrew about the first of January.

Mrs. C. M. Dick Dead. Watertown, N.Y., Feb. 9.—Mrs. Celestine Matilda Dick, wife of George Dick of this city, died at the family home, No. 122 Colburn street, last evening, aged fifty-one years. She is survived by her husband, her mother, Mrs. Melvina Burgoyne, Camden East, Ont.; two sons, and one daughter.
