

(1) At least six months residence upon stead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by sch person residing with and a downright imposition. APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, betore the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.
