IRISH EXCAVATIONS.

Flourishing Hamlet in Julius Caesar's Time.

Prof, Weber, the Munich archaeolo gist, has been excavating an Irish o Celtic village near Manching, an hour from Ingolstadt. The village lies about ten feet below the surface, and probably was a flourishing hamlet in the time of Julius Caesar. It is sur rounded by a wall, and has an exten sive cemetery. Some of the graves at pear to have been opened before, but from those which had not been dis turbed many interesting facts bearing upon ancient Celtic life have been dis losed. The bodies were clothed woollen coats, held together by pins and by a girdle at the waist, and short woollen trousers were also worn and possibly shoes, though no remain of the latter have been found. 
