HONOR THE KAISER HIS SILVER WEDDING ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATED.

Berlin, Feb. 27.—Twenty-five years ago to-day, on February 27th, 1881, Emperor William, then crown prince of Prussia, and incidentally of the empire of the united Germany, was married to the Princess Augusta Victoria of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Augustenburg, then a girl barely twenty-two.

According to the original programme the wedding anniversary was to be a grand state occasion and the emperor and empress were to be invited to the German empire and to the celebration. It was also intended to have the wedding of Prince Eitel Friedrich, second son of the emperor, to Duchess Sophie Charlotte of Oldenburg, take place on the same day.
