

the wheat enters has come by the successful extraction of nitrates from the atmosphere in form and quantity applicable as fertilizer. He recalls the ediction made five years ago by Sir Villiam Crooks that the world's po pulation was increasing so rapidly that the supply of wheat would soon be insufficient to feed it unless artifihal means were found to increase the find this means.

Sir William Ramsay calls attention to the fact that the air over each square mile of the earth's surface contains enough free nitrogen to afford plant food for sixty years of the world's consumption if it were only combined, and its value would about \$2,500,000,000,000 if it were in the form of saltpeter.

A large plant is now being erected in Norway, where it is proposed to cause nitrogen and oxygen to combe applied to the soil. This will be put on the market in three forms 13.5 per cent, of nitrogen, the second will be in crystals, and the third will be the basic salt. This last named forms a dry powder, which does not turn moist by exposure to the air. It is estimated that the present source of combined nitrogen, on the eastern slopes of the Andes, will not last beyond 1950, and from this it would appear that the work of the gentlemen up in Norway has not begun any too soon.
