Toronto Telegram. There was a very large attendance Thursday, at Webb's by the members of the Empire Club for their weekly luncheon. Prof. Clark presided, and briefly introduced E. J. B. Pense, on the subject of journalism. The speaker dwelt on the growth of Toronto in the last twenty years, from 100,000 to 250,000 people, and this he attributed in great measure to the influence of the press. He instanced the case of Gov. Simcoe as having practically established the newspaper in Upper Canada, now the province of Ontario. Simcoe, when he came here in 1793, had three main objects in view, with several subsidiary ones. He wished to form an aristo cratic form of government, a church, and a newspaper press, Mr.
