bonized-Two Rescuers Perish. Paris, March 12,-The explosion of fire damp, which occurred in a colliery at Courriers, near Calais, on Saturday morning, resulted in one of the most appalling mining catastrophes in history.

Eighteen hundred men were at work in the mine at the time, and of these 1,200 have almost instantly perished by fire or asphyxiation.

Shortly before two o'clock, on Saturday morning, there was a terrible explosion in pits 2, 3, and 5. It was so violent that the cages in the shafts were blown out, wrecking the structures at the mouths of the pits. 
