Montreal, March 12.-About 1,000 head of butchers' cattle, 120 calves, 60 mileh cows, 20 sheep and lambs and 200 fat hogs were offered for sale at the East End Abattoir to-day. The butchers were out strong, and there was a good demand for the best cattle, and prices remain unchanged. Prime beeves sold at 42c, to 58c, pe lb.; pretty good animals, 34c. to 21c. to 31c. per lb. 
