PRESIDENT OF ALLIANCE MAKES CHARGES.

In Letter Replying to Deputation Setting Forth Jewish Contentions Against Bill Now Before Parliament-Jew is An Anachronism.

Montreal, March 17.-Rev. Dr. Edgar Hill, president of the Lord's Day Alliance of Montreal, who has INITIAL EXHIBIT been active in connection with the promotion of the bill now before par iament, seeking for more stringent enforcement of Sunday observance, has published a letter in reply to the contentions of the deputation which visited Ottawa, on Thursday, for the purpose of setting forth the contentions of the Jewish population of Montreal in respect to their objections to being forced to observe two days of rest. "The bill in question, says Dr Hil "is the bill of a Christian government, in a Christian land. apology needs to be made to the Jews for that fact, just because no bill devised by Christian men could pos ibly meet the views of the Jews in that regard." He adds; "In our civic experience we do not find the Jews to be the law-akiling and Sabbath-keeping inoffensive community which Rabbi De Sela claims they desire to be." He then goes on to enumerate that bakers, eigar dealers and newspaper ven dors of the Jewish persuasion are the principal offenders against the present

"The trouble with the Jews every where," adds Dr. Hill, "in London as well as in Montreal, is that the Jew is an anachronism in modern society. Further on in his letter Dr. Hill says: The Jewish Sabbath being held on a different day in the week from the Christian Sunday, may be unfortunate for the Jews. But on British soil they get many privileges which are denied them elsewhere, and most of them probably prefer life in Canada, with the security of protection of the British law and justice, even with that disadvantage, to life in Germany, Russia. or even France, with the history of the last twenty years behind them. They ought to be at least thankfu for this good land in which they have found a peaceful home on this con-


