VERY LITTLE SLEEP

HERMIT MONARCH PASSES SLEEPLESS NIGHTS.

Daily Life in Practical Exile—He Abhors Society—Quarrels With the Grand Duke's Frequent Feature of His Dreary Routine.
St. Petersburg, March 28.—An interesting light is thrown on the czar's life as a private letter from an officer of the imperial bodyguard, who has been attached to the czar's entourage for the past two years.
"Ever since 'Red Sunday,'" he writes, "the czar's existence has been one unending series of anxieties, which have told very heavily upon him. Only among his family does he apparently forget the manner of the revolution, threatening news of which reaches him with the merciless regularity of the ticking of the clock. These are indeed, his only moments of happiness and relaxation from the worries and cares of state."
The rare exception of a walk or a ride in the park, which, however, has become a very rare occurrence of late.

"His majesty invariably spends almost the entire day and night in his private cabinet, either on consultation with his councillors, whom he often summons to his presence at any hour of the night in order to ask their advice, or in work upon projected measures of reform. He writes often for hours at a stretch."
"At other times the sentries placed at his door hear him pacing restlessly up and down the room till the early hours of the morning, waiting anxiously for reports from the representatives in the provinces. At intervals he will despatch a message, and then suddenly throwing open the windows gaze out on the quietness of the night through which his millions of subjects slumber, while their unfortunate ruler is still at work."

"His majesty," the letter continues, "was never a lover of social functions, but now he appears to abhor society more than ever."
"The czar himself seems to be the only person at court who actually realizes the dangers of the present situation, and it is to this fact that the misunderstandings between his majesty and the grand dukes owe their cause. The czar alone recognizes that a genuine revolution is afooting in Russia, and the more closely he notes the symptoms and compares them with those of the French revolution, the more his anxiety appears to increase. He is no longer his noble eyes dimmed with the mists of sorrow."
SLATER WIDELY DISCUSSED.

His Attitude on the Tariff Question Explained.
A rival manufacturer expressed indignation the other day in Montreal because of the publicity which had been given to Charles E. Slater and the Slater shoe by the press and by the government on Mr. Slater's attitude against increasing the price of shoes by increasing the tariff. The Slater shoe and its system and specialized factory were discussed editorially in every newspaper of an prominence in the Dominion of Canada and by many American newspapers.
The Montreal Gazette, a strong prohibitive tariff paper, thought it had discovered the secret of President Slater's attitude when it informed its readers that Mr. Slater was the only shoe manufacturer in Canada who had equipped his factory and so specialized it as to be in a position of splendid isolation.

Winnipeg Legal Rumors.
Winnipeg, March 28.—It is stated in legal circles that H. M. Howell, K.C. will be appointed chief justice of appeal for Manitoba, and that Isaac Pridmore will be appointed judge of the king's bench. The name of C. P. Wilson also has cropped up as a judge of the appeal court.
The appointments are necessary owing to the act passed at the last session in the Dominion respecting a court of appeal for Manitoba.

Western Wheat Crop Last Year.
Ottawa, March 28.—The wheat crop of Canada, west of Lake Superior last year amounted to 88,418,000. Of this, 47,574,570 bushels have been inspected and sent east and 25,383,250 are still to be marketed.
Fourteen and three-quarter millions of this year's country elevators, and ten millions in the hands of the farmers in addition to the amount being held for seed, which is estimated at eight and a half millions. The figures have been compiled by the chief warehouse commissioners.

Summer Coat For the Small Maid.
Here is a splendid model for the washable coat of heavy lines or pique which includes. They are far dressier than the garment of some light-weight woolen material, more adapted to the needs of summer-time, and it might be said, improve with each visit to the weekly wash. The Russian blouse pattern is followed in this example, deep single box pleats set either side of the centre front and back, the double-breasted front, closing made with medium-sized pearl buttons. The deep capelle collar, reaching almost to the waist-line in front, is scalloped about with linen thread, the deep turnback cuffs of the bishop sleeve and the little round turn-over collar finished in the same manner. The broad stitched belt is worn over the pleats instead of under, it being stitched to the coat at the centre-back.
