SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any seven numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 20, reserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is at least 18 years of age, or any male over 18 years of age, by the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres more or less.
