Dr. Haanel was fortunate in having associated with him in the experi ments Dr. Heroult, of La Praz, France, who superintended the erection of the furnace, and with these results. That magnetite ore can be melted as readily as hemetite, and with qually valuable outputs; that charcoal can be used as well as coke; and that experiments with briquetted nick eliferous pyrrotite were equally successful. The estimated value of th ferro-nickel -pig, virtually free from sulphur, is from \$40 to \$44 per ton, and as the Lake Superior Power company have thousands of tons of the briquettes in stock they will acquire the government plant and convert


