AN AWFUL HUNGER DRIVEN BY FAMINE INTO CANNIBALISM.

Member of Siberian Tribe and His Daughter Eat Relative After Seeing Seven of Family Die of Starvation.

St. Petersburg, May 1.—An account of a remarkable case of cannibalism comes from Sredne-Kolymsk, in the province of Yakutsk, Eastern Siberia. A member of the tribe of Yukagirs, a dying race, was in December last brought to Sredne-Kolymsk and lodged in jail. According to the Nasha Shien, he and his daughter are charged with having eaten the man's nephew, whom he killed at the entreaties of his daughter. After that the Yukagir, though he had caught a swan, continued to eat human flesh, because he had acquired a taste for it. The elder of the tribe said that he discovered the cannibal's daughter in the act of devouring a boiled human head.

The explanation of this atrocious custom is to be found in the fact that famine is chronic in the district of Kolymsk. Seven members of the Yukagir's family having died of starvation before his eyes, the man became a cannibal and killed the nephew in order to appease his and his daughter's hunger.

The correspondent of the Nasha Shien takes the authorities of the district severely to task for having sent a number of half-naked and half-starved Yukagirs on a shooting and fishing expedition for trading purposes on the upper reaches of the Kolymsa, Yasachonaja, and Popova rivers during the season which lasted from February 10th to June 29th, without having supplied them with sufficient provisions.

The fate which may overtake people thus sent to the extreme north for the purpose of trade is illustrated by the experiences of a number of Chukchis, who dwell on the upper reaches of the rivers Omolon and (Ilo) for two years, during which they lost all their reindeer through disease and themselves had to undergo terrible sufferings from famine.

With difficulty they dragged on their wretched existence until the beginning of June, 1905. Then it became clear that nothing but starvation awaited them. They called a general meeting of the tribe, and after deliberations lasting a whole day decided that the head of every family should kill all its members and then put an end to his own life.

On the morning of the following day all was over. On a high rise of ground all who had lived the day before lay dead, closely huddled together. A whole tribe had committed its own destruction, not a soul surviving.
