JAPS' PLANS For The Re-opening Of Korea.

FOR FOREIGN TRADE BUILDING OF A SYSTEM OF RAILROADS

Through the Hermit Nation—The Japs in Thirteen Months Have Constructed 310 Miles of Railroad.
