**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS**

Any numbered section of Dominion lands in Manitoba, Ontario, British Columbia, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of the whole or a section of 160 acres more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local office for the district in which the land is situated.

**HOMESTEAD DUTIES:** A settler who has been granted a homestead is bound to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

- At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.
- If the father (or mother, if the latter is deceased) of the person who is desirous to take a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides on a farm in the vicinity of the land, and if by such person as a homesteader, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.
- If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

**APPLICATION FOR PATENT** should be made at the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.

Before making applications for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.**

Coal-land may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 250 acres can be acquired by an individual, and may be acquired by a partnership, company or firm of 2,000 pounds shall be collected from the gross output.

Quarterly fee for a miner's certificate is \$5 per annum in advance of the date of issue, and \$10 per annum for a complete certificate.

A free miner, having discovered mineral in place, may locate a claim 1,500x1,500 feet.

The fee for recording a claim is \$5. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year or paid to the mining fees expended or paid, the locator may, upon having a survey made, and upon complying with other requirements, purchase the land at \$1 an acre.

The patent provides for the payment of a royalty of 25 per cent on the sales.

PLACED claimants receive a 100-foot square; entry fee \$5, renewable yearly.

A free miner may obtain two leases to prospect for gold or five miles each for a term of twenty years, renewable at the discretion of the Minister of the Interior.

The lease shall have a dredge in operation for each five miles. Rental \$100 for each mile of river leased.

ROYALTY: 25 per cent on the gross output, and the output after it exceeds \$10,000.


