SEARCHING FOR IT

THAT SILVER MINE NEAR HAVELOCK, ONT.

Hunters Who Found Silver Are Camping Near the Site, Trying to Re-Discover It.

Havelock, Ont., May 8.—The facts in regard to the much-talked-of silver mine near Havelock have leaked out at last, and that there is such a mine is no idle talk, as many supposed.

In the fall of last year Messrs. Thomas McMillan of town, John Anderson and N. Whitney of Belmont, were deer hunting in the vicinity of Sandy Lake, Methuen township. Late one afternoon they got lost in a big swamp to the north-east of the lake, and while wandering around stumbled across a peculiar looking vein of rock. McMillan and Whitney broke off samples, and Anderson never paid any attention to it. No heed was taken of the discovery where the specimens were found, and as it was near sunset, the trio thought no more about the matter, and started on their way to find their camp. After they had returned to their homes the specimens were examined, and somewhat more carefully, and finally given to others, who had them assayed, when it was found that they were almost pure silver.

This gave rise to many rumors, but no one had any idea where the ore was produced from until lately, when it transpired that the three discoverers had journeyed back to the swamp this spring, and for five days had searched in vain for the spot where the silver was waiting to enrich some fortunate person.

Since then many have tried to find the mine, which is located on crown land, and which will probably become the property of the one lucky enough to discover it. At present Mr. McMillan and Alexander Rose of town are camped near the swamp, and are thoroughly inspecting the ground where the former thinks he found the specimen.

EDITORIAL NOTES.

Seven miles of concrete or artificial walks will be laid this year. If more work be undertaken a third staff of men must be organized.

The coal strike averted! All honor to Mitchell, the leader of the miners' union. It was for him to say whether there should be a heart-breaking strike and he called it off. The wisdom of the man is worthy of all praise.

The late J. B. McKay represented a type of man not too much in evidence. He was painstaking, industrious, persevering, amiable, honorable, helpful. Alas, that such an one should fall when in the zenith of his usefulness.

The educational bill in England may eventually become the means of dividing the people religiously. The church of England and the Catholic church are lining up against all other forms of every denomination. Exciting times ahead for the board or national school becomes a reality.

FACTS COME OUT.

The Manitoba election cases have been reviewed in Ottawa on complaint of the local government. It will be remembered that after the last dominion campaign certain election agents were indicted for illegal acts, to wit, changing the provincial voters' lists so that they would be made applicable to the federal boundaries for electoral purposes. The charge was that the officials had mutilated the lists, and in consequence had disfranchised many persons.

The grievance was fully presented in the courts of Manitoba, where the officials were put upon their trial and "no bills" returned by the grand jury. The evidence in one case was taken in full, and it exonerated him from all blame, the presiding judge taking the side of the accused in plainly stating that his proceeding was both legal and reasonable.

The attempt has been made to show that the Committee on Election Laws was not favourably disposed to the airing of this case at Ottawa. The committee does not appear to have objected to the facts, but it was willing to get at all of them. The counsel for the government of Manitoba—the men who prosecuted the officials in the court—did not like the idea that their clients had, by a manoeuvre in 1901 and change in the law, removed the appointment of registration clerks from the judges and undertaken to influence in that and other ways the dominion elections.

The information came out, however, and it will have its effect on this appeal to Ottawa. There may be a change in the election law, but it will not be to discredit and discourage the judges in the performance of their duty, but to keep the local government in its place and make it mind its own business.

The \$85,000 By-Law.

The by-law in connection with the electric light and gas plants will go to a vote the people as soon as the necessary advertising can be done. However the public will regard it may depend upon the enlightenment they receive meanwhile. The security for the \$85,000 is supplied by the light and power consumers, and by the city and the property owners. Let that be clearly understood.

The city guarantees the debentures. The interest on them is a first charge against the earnings of the plant, and is almost certain to be met without fail. But if not the city is responsible. It is pledged to make good the debt out of the general assessment. It is perhaps well to remember this during the discussion, though the qualified voters are largely the owners of real estate.

The necessity for the expenditure is pressed by the management, endorsed by Mr. Ross, the Montreal expert. The situation should be emphasized in three ways, (1) by a statement showing in detail the machinery which will be scrapped or sold; (2) by a statement showing in detail the machinery which will take its place and the cost thereof; and (3) the net saving which these changes and improvements will effect. Sixteen Years For Wife Murder.

Malone, N.Y., May 8.—Herbert Miller today pleaded guilty to murder in the first degree for shooting his wife last October and was sentenced to serve sixteen years in Dannemora prison. Previous to the shooting Miller had been drinking heavily for several days. He was about to go on a hunting trip and had his rifle in his hand, when an argument began between him and his wife. In the midst of it, and without warning, he shot her in the head. Afterwards he tried to kill himself, both by shooting and by cutting his throat.
