In this work he was aided by Herbert D. Crane, once a missionary worker, later a guard at the workhouse and a man who naturally gravitated toward uplifting the fallen.

While serving as a guard, Mr. Crane organized a night school for prisoners, and, when Mr. Cooley learned of this, he cave Crane free rein to carry
