BY-LAW NO. 1906

James McFarland Was An Applicant—Steele Has Amuck Through the Streets and One of Them Had to Be Killed.

Gananoque, May 17.—In the police court yesterday afternoon, Edward Shields pleaded guilty to the charge against him, before Police Magistrate Henshaw, and was let off with fine and costs, amounting to \$8.50.

The board of license commissioners met here on Tuesday. Present: Messrs. Farver, Green and Johnson. After considering the question of license for the American Hotel, for which Messrs. James McFarland, Kingston, Neil McCarney and George Genge have been negotiating, it was unanimously decided to grant no license to the house.

At the adjourned citizens' meeting held last evening in the town hall, committees were drafted for July 1st, celebration, under the direction of a management committee consisting of Mayor Wilson, chairman; Clark Allen, secretary, and W. A. Lewis, treasurer. It was also decided to have a hard time parade in the evening.

Quite an exciting time occurred yesterday afternoon, along the main street, of the town, caused by six stores. One of them got in behind Gibson's factory, between the fume and the wall of the building. It had to be lassoed and about forty men succeeded in rescuing it. The two others ran into Mr. Fairman's kitchen, upsetting the stove and out through the other door, through the garden of Rev. Mr. Serson, and Chief Ryan. At last one of them had to be killed.

At Grasshopper Park this evening, the Wanderers' baseball club defeated a picked nine by a score of nine to one, in a five inning game.

Mary Simmers, wife of F. Willis, barber, King street passed away at St. Vincent de Paul Hospital, at nine o'clock yesterday morning, in the thirtieth year of her age. Deceased has suffered for some time past with consumption. The remains were brought here this evening.

SPORTING NOTES. Interesting Items on Various Sporting Matters.

Montreal came easy for the anti-moore troupe, which has won five straight games.

It has been arranged to have Toronto and New York baseball at Hamilton on August 7th, during the old boys' reunion.

The Hamilton council made a grant of \$500 to William Sherring. This is exclusive of the grant of the city of \$1000. The Sherring fund, now amounts to \$2,500.

In the Sportsman an Irish writer claims that Sherring, the winner of the Marathon race, is not a Canadian, strictly speaking, but a Scotch Canadian. Getting a little further back, Sherring is Scotch, as the Irish came originally from Scotland. Then we might trace him further back by means of the Darwinian evolution theory.

A baseball game between Macon and Jacksonville, of the South Atlantic league, came near being broken up by one of the players, a Cuban, being a negro. There was an interchange of blows between Viola, of Jacksonville, and Chandler, of Macon. Ponce had to interfere finally.

The Brandon lacrosse players who were expelled for playing on Sunday in Chicago have not yet furnished the evidence which was to justify their reinstatement, according to the decision of the annual convention. If they do not present it at the next C.L.A. meeting, it is not likely their case will be taken up this season.

"Tod" Downey, the veteran defence felder of the St. Catharines Athletics, has hung up his stick for good. He is thirty-three years of age, and has been playing senior lacrosse for the past eighteen years, playing his first game when he was sixteen years of age. Besides playing, on his home team, he has figured on the Toronto and Montreal teams.

NAVY CHANGES FAST. Retired 40 Warships in Past Four Years.

London, May 17.—The rapidity with which Great Britain is removing from the navy all but her really efficient warships was evidenced by a statement presented to parliament today, showing that no less than thirty-five battleships and cruisers have practically been removed from the list since 1902.

The exact figures are eight battleships, ten cruisers and three protected cruisers removed from the active list, and six more from the reserve list, the smallest fighting value. During the same period the construction of thirteen new battleships, eighteen armored cruisers and protected cruisers was completed.
