EXEMPTION EXPLAINED.

The Matter Discussed by the W. Crothers Co.

Kingston, May 25 .- (To the Editor) The question has been asked by rate payers, how is it that our exemption by-law asks that as an assessment be fixed at \$8,500, when the assessment for this year is \$15,000 ? I will make explanations which I trust will be explicit and quite satisfactory to all interested. In 1904 the assessment of the factory was \$8,500. As more ac commodation became necessary an ad dition was erected in 1905, which increased the figures by \$2,000. A change in the assessment act provides for 60 per cent. rate on the value of the real estate. This is a new departure. The assessor, however, rated us as a wholesale house instead of a manufacturing concern and added 75 per cent. instead of 60 per cent., thus running may fairly be considered a matter of
