DEATH OF JOHN KNOWLES

Leaves on This Continent Very Few Pioneers of Music-At One Time He Was the Only United States Composer.

The death of John Knowles Paine leaves on this continent very few pioneers of musical instruction. Last fall heaving eight has according to her hull.
