SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any one numbered section of Dominion Lands in Ontario or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one quarter section, of 160 acres more or less.

Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situate.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under the following plans:

(1) At least six months residence upon the cultivation of the land to be made during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is eligible to make a homestead entry under the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land applied for, such person, as a homesteadee, shall be required to reside on the land prior to obtaining patent, and may be satisfied by the evidence of the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land, owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by evidence upon the same land.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.

Before making applications for patent the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS. A Coal-land may be purchased at \$10 per acre for soft coal and \$20 for anthracite. Not more than 320 acres can be acquired by one individual company. Royalty at the rate of ten cents per ton of 2,000 lbs. shall be collected on the gross output.

Miner's certificate is granted upon payment in advance of \$5 per annum for an individual, and from \$50 to \$100 per annum for a company according to capital.

A free miner may obtain two leases to mine for gold or silver on a claim of 100 acres, one for twenty years, renewable at the expiration of the first term, and the other for ten years, renewable at the expiration of the first term.

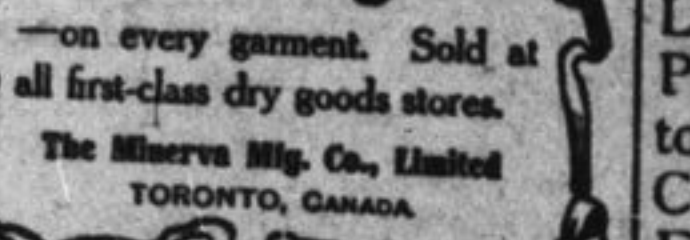
