THINGS THEATRICAL

BERNHARDT IN "TESS OF THE D'URBERVILLES."

Astoria Day in England—Viola Allen to Play "Cymbeline"—The Matinee at the Doomed—Nance O'Hara intends to finish up next season in Australia.

Lionel Lincoln's latest opera, "The Youth of Figaro," will have its first presentation in the United States. "Madama Butterfly" will be produced for the first time in America in Washington about the middle of October.

Montgomery and Stone, formerly of "The Wizard of Oz," will star next season in "The Red Mill," by Victor Herbert.

"The Marriage of Kitty," has been revived in London, with Marie Tempest and Ellis Jeffreys in their original parts.

Viola Allen will appear in the new Astor theatre, New York, during October in an elaborate production of "Cymbeline."

Finero's latest play, "His House in Order," has been translated into Italian and produced at the theatre Manzoni in Milan.

Francis Wilson has written the libretto of a musical comedy called "Little Dolly Waters." It will be produced by Klaw & Erlanger, next fall.

The original company and production of "The Man on the Box," headed by Henry E. Dixey, goes to England next November for a London presentation.

The American rights to Stephen Phillips' play, Paolina and Franconia, have been purchased for the use of Henry B. Irving, when he comes to America next season.

Edith M. Crane has arranged to appear at the Savoy theatre, New York, at the end of August in a new four-act play by Alfred Sutro, entitled "The Price of Money."

The big matinee has been doomed. The Countess de Grafaldu has formed a league for the encouragement of the wearing of the small theatre hat.

NO CRIMINAL COURTS

Needed Down in the Wilds of Labrador.

In all of Labrador, with its 1,000 miles of seaboard, there is no court or jail, no magistrate or policeman. Labrador has a resident population of 10,000, of whom 3,000 are white, settled along its south coast.

Many of the Indians are half-breeds, and there are 3,000 Eskimos scattered along the northern water front. In addition, it is visited each summer by some 20,000 Newfoundlanders, who engage in fishing, which is the chief pursuit of these people.

For thirty-three years there has been no session of court held, and in fifty years the only criminal charge which is recorded is that against an Eskimo, whose felony was accused against him in his village, and who shot the man as he walked with her.

Forty years ago a circuit court was sent there every summer, but, as it was found to do nothing, it was abolished. When any serious charge is made now a magistrate is sent from Newfoundland to attend to it.

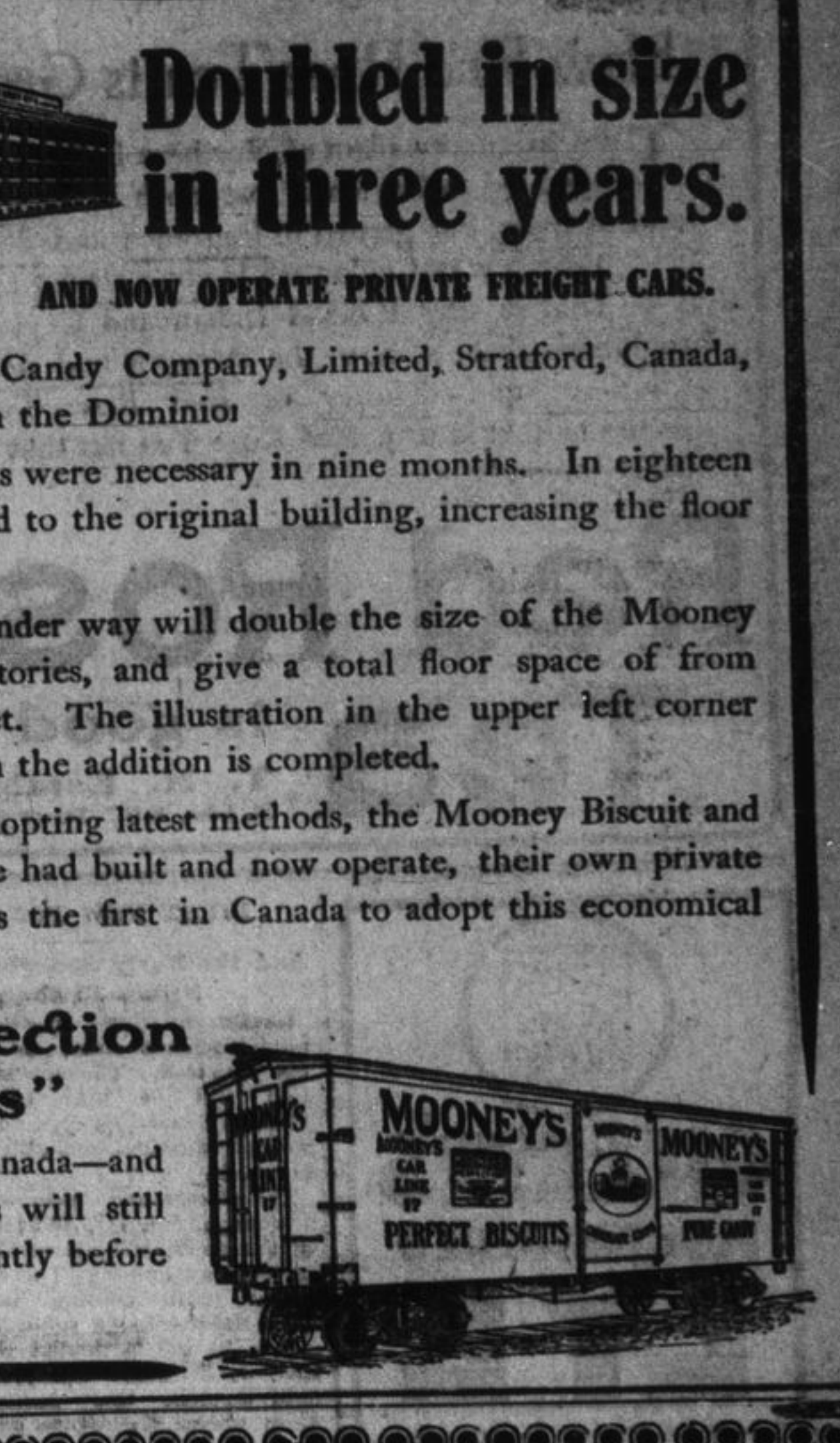
Started in 1903, more ovens were necessary in nine months. In eighteen months, another wing was added to the original building, increasing the floor space by 18,000 square feet.
