

Hauls were lengthened and fares cut down thirty three per cent. To-day one may ride half a mile for one cent; two and one third miles for two cents; and three and a half miles for three cents. For fares are arranged on the zone system. You pay for what you get. The main thing is, what does the average rider pay? In 1905, it was 1.89 cents, while the average fare charged mile was nine-tenths of a cent. Of the 196,000,000 passengers carried, thirty per cent, paid but one cent., sixty per cent, but two cents, and only ten per cent, of the total number carried paid more than the latter sum. All fares in excess of two cents might be abolished and the earnings would hardly
