HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres more or less. Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate receive authority for some one to make entry for him.

(1) at least six months residence eligible to make a homestead entry un-der the provisions of his Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-

stend, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with

APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector.
