SYNOP IS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominton Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Provinces, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section, of 160 acres more or less. local land office for the district in which the land to be taken is situated, or if the homesteader desires, he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior. Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the local agent for the district in which the land is situate receive authority for some one to make entry for him. HOMESTEAD DUTIES: A settler who has been granted an entry for a home-stead is required to perform the con-ditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) at least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land is each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) of any person who is emilible to make a homestend entry unuer the provisions of this Act, resides about a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent (3) If the settler has his permanent esidence upon farming land owned by im in the vicinity of his homestead, the

quirements of this Act as to residence ay be satisfied by residence upon the APPLICATION FOR PATENT should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the
Homestead Inspector.

Before making applications for patent
the suttler must give six month's notice
in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of his intention
to do so.


