ANOTHER BUTCHERY

SIGNS OF FRESH DISASTER IN ISRAEL.

The World Cold and Indifferent to the Sufferings of God's Chosen People—The Jews Must Arise Themselves.

Jerusalem Daily News, (New York). The signs of fresh disaster to Israel which have recently been visible on the Russian horizon were no mirage, no phantasm conjured by fear, the signs were real, the omens true. They pointed to Bialystok!

That can be said now, in face of this last horror. What outcry can be made, that has not already been made? What prayer offered—what curse hurled? The vials of human grief, the yell of anguish are exhausted. Odious rent our hearts to the last degree of anguish and drained our last tear. Our emotions in the presence of Bialystok are different.

We will waste no time and no breath in clamoring to the world for help and intervention. We have learned our lesson well. There is nothing that we can expect for ourselves, and our brethren save from ourselves. The world is deaf and cold to us and indifferent to our suffering. It will not stir hand or even finger to help us. If we do not rescue ourselves from the lethargy of hope, if we do not grip our joints and steel our hearts to the point of our own saving, we are doomed. Russia is the burial place and the hell of Israel. The longer Israel dwells in the land of the Moslems, the nearer is the hour of his annihilation.

They have been talking so hopefully of equal rights. A party has been created, a group organized to stand forth boldly for Jewish rights, and Israel has turned hopefully to this new saviour, praying for its success. But what will this success boot us? Suppose Jews are granted or win equal rights—what then? Will that fact save the holocaust? Will that fact close the crater as massacre? Will it save even one life?

It is claimed that the Moslems is not to blame. It is said for him that if left to himself he will not let his hands in Jewish blood. What comfort is there in that the face of the absolute knowledge that he can be spurred and incited, by demagogue or official, to murder? When the Moslem plays popular politics it will be the same as it is now, the defeated political gamblers will have ready tools with which to wreak revenge. Our opponents in St. Petersburg, correspondents makes the wisest father in his thoughts. The possibility of incitement will never be removed!

Adroit enough was the preparation for Bialystok. To throw a bomb into a religious procession is to make it appear that the Jews are enemies of the "true religion." Simple-minded, pious men and women, attacked while at worship! Monster! Who can sympathize with the Jew if the can shippers turn upon them and read them limb from limb for this "vandalic desecration of the body of Christ? How easy for the heathen to turn on themselves? But is it conceivable that any Jew would be so madly foolhardy, so wastefully reckless as to deliberately do that which is bound to lead to the destruction of his brethren?

But the argument is futile! In every town and hamlet of Russia the story of the Jew who threw the bomb at the body of Christ is now being told. It is proven beyond doubt, that the Jews are enemies of the country and the religion. Now will the wail-hounds of rapine be unleashed to do their bloody work, and the police will with their hands off it—after having started it.

Who threw this bomb? Bundist or policeman? Foolhardy and reckless as the former is, we shall have to have unmistakable evidence of a guilt. Most probably, judging by all that has been revealed, it was a policeman or hireling of the police acting under orders of the atrocity. It is probably the beginning of the promised chapter of new horrors. Israel is entering on a new chapter of horror. God knows what the end will be!

And meanwhile—what shall we do? Merely seek bread and milk?

Traces of Prehistoric Race.

Berlin, July 5.—At the last meeting of the Academy of Sciences in this city, some interesting details were given by the Prussian Exploration Expedition to Chinese Turkestan.

A letter was read from Prof. Gruenwedel, chemist, near Kutchah, stating that the Mingol Caves had been explored, but that the expected find of manuscripts had proved insignificant. The Japanese having cleared most of their way into the caves, interesting archaeological discoveries, however, were made.

Romantic were found of persons belonging to a red-haired, blue-eyed race, evidently the founders in the Mingol caves, and bearing garments of unmistakable-Transian origin. A number of huge iron swords were also discovered. Search revealed the existence of further numerous Buddhist frescoes containing many figures. The temples seemed, in fact, to have been a sort of Buddhist Pantheon.

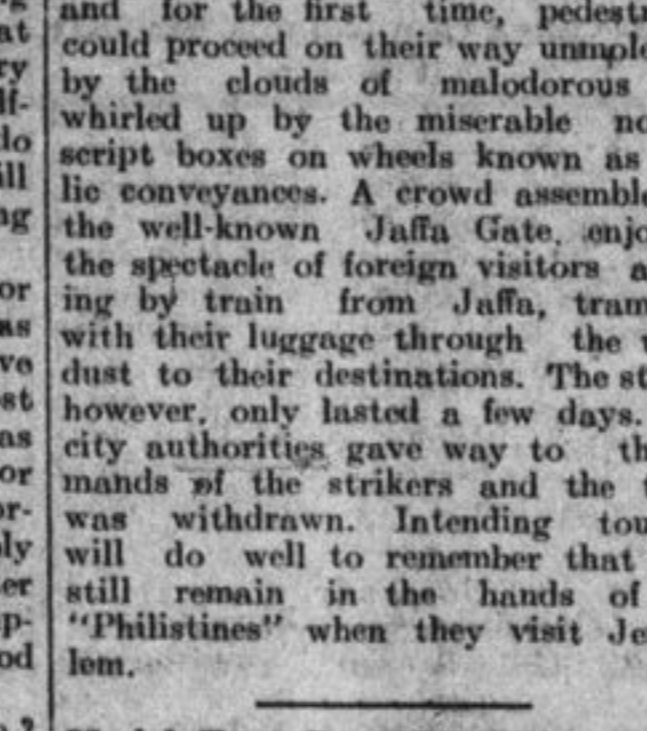
Moscow, July 5.—A band of terrorists consisting of thirty-five young men, with a full equipment of bombs and revolvers, has been captured by the police here.

CAB STRIKE IN JERUSALEM.

How This Interesting Event Was Brought About.

Constantinople, July 5.—Interesting reports of a strike of the cabs in the Holy City, have arrived from Jerusalem. It was brought about in the following manner: The Turkish authorities, moved at last by the bitter complaints of the traveling public, made a feeble attempt to grapple with the regular traffic of legs, and overcharging on the part of local Jews, and the horse and carriage owners, from which visitors to the cradle of Christianity have suffered so long. A regular tax of legs fares was introduced, much to the disgust of the drivers and proprietors, who saw their revenue, obtained from fleecing tourists, appreciably diminished in future. So angry was the mob, and for the first time, pedestrians could proceed on their way unmolested by the clouds of malodorous dust whirled up by the miserable ponies with their regular loads of passengers. A crowd assembled at the well-known Jafa Gate, enjoying the spectacle of foreign visitors arriving by train from Jafa, tramping with their luggage through the thick dust to their destinations. The strike, however, only lasted a few days. The city authorities gave way to the demand of the strikers, and the tax was withdrawn. Intending tourists will do well to remember that they still remain in the hands of the "Philistines" when they visit Jerusalem.
